What are we learning this term?

Children will be in sets for maths, reading and grammar. This will enable teaching to be closely targeted to your child's specific needs.



Homework

Maths: It is expected that each child will use Maths Whizz (www.whizz.com) for at least 60 minutes a week. We have seen huge improvements in maths from those children that regularly use it.

Reading: Your child should be reading regularly, at least four times a week.



Spelling: Children have fortnightly spelling lists to learn.

Projects: Your child has a project set every half term. Look out for the first one which links to our Magic Box poetry work in English.
