

# RE Big Question: What does Jesus mean to Christians?



## KEY VOCABULARY

Omnipotent - all powerful.
Omniscient - knows all things
Eternal - God created time and is not limited by it - God is outside time: God does not get old like human beings.
Holy - God is morally pure and hates sin - God is separate from human beings, who are sinful.
Loving - God wants the very best for human beings and does a lot to care for them.
Spirit - God is not physical - God does not have a body.
Holy Trinity - God is one God but is the <b>Father</b> , the <b>Son</b> and the <b>Holy Spirit</b> .
Incarnation - God became man in the form of Jesus Christ, the Son (part of the Holy Trinity).

Christians believe that Jesus was the Messiah and was sent by God to be our saviour.


People of the Jewish faith believe that we are still awaiting the Messiah.
