

KEY VOCABULARY

Incarnation: God made flesh (human)

Messiah: A leader regarded as the saviour of a particular country, group, or cause.

Hebrew: The language spoken and the group of people.

Bethlehem: Where Mary and Joseph travelled for the census and birthplace of Jesus.

Nazareth: Home place for Mary and Jesus grew up here.

New Testament: The second part of the Christian bible made up of the gospels and other books.

Book: The bible is split into books, mostly named after who wrote them.

Chapter: A section of a book in the bible normally shown by a big number and sometimes a subheading.

Verse: Sections of the chapters, normally shown by a number.

Why is incarnation important to Christians?

Christians believe that God is one but is known in three separate Persons:

- God the Father
- God the Son
- God the Holy Spirit

The term **Jesus as God Incarnate** is the Christian belief that Jesus is God in human form. This is the part of the Trinity known as 'God the Son'.

'So God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life'
John 3:16
