

Can someone be a true Sikh without performing Sewa?



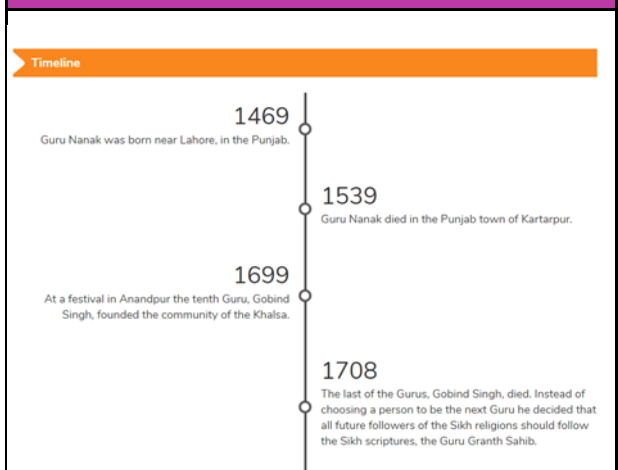
KEY VOCABULARY

Guru Nanak—the first Sikh
Panj Pyrae—The 5 beloved
Guru Gobind Singh—last living Guru
Khalsa—baptised Sikhs who wear the 5 Ks
Amrit—the ceremony to join the Khalsa
Waheguru—the Sikh's name for God.
Nishan Sahib—flag flown outside Sikh temples.

Sikhs believe that everyone should help others selflessly.

The most holy place for Sikhs is the **Golden Temple of Amritsar**, Harmandir Sahib, in Punjab in India.

Sikh comes from the word *sikha* which means disciple.
