

## KEY VOCABULARY

United Kingdom: The island of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
Great Britain: The Island made up of England, Scotland and Wales
British Isles: A group of islands made up of; Great Britain, Ireland, the Isle of Man, the Hebrides and over 6000 smaller islands.
National Emblem: A symbol of that country.
Multicultural: People of several different cultural backgrounds or ethnicity living alongside each other.
Region: An area of a country or the world having definable characteristics but not always fixed boundaries.
Counties: Specific divisions of land/area within a country.
Climate: The weather conditions in an area.
Temperate: A region or climate of mild temperature.
