Unfortunately there is now NO GARDENING CLUB.

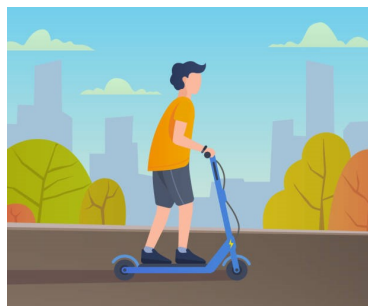


ABSENCE REPORTING
