Year 3 looked at a range of Pop Art and recreated some iconic pieces. They used cotton buds to make the Ben-Day dots.



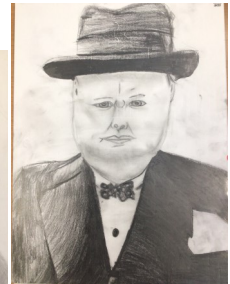
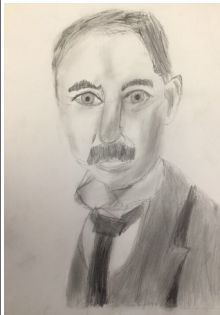
