### Our school

#### The physical environment of the school matches the aspirational nature of our vision.

The physical environment of the school matches the aspirational nature of our vision. There is wireless broadband throughout, as well as iPads, laptops and state-of-the-art technology in every classroom.

Our multi-use hall caters for a wide range of activities, from daily assemblies and lunch, PE, drama and music productions and out of school activities such as sports and dance clubs.

Our Year 6 Centre is a brand new, purpose-built block which is cool, airy and light. Not only has this superb facility helped us achieve consistently higher SATs results, but it also helps our Year 6 students with the transition to high school. Outside, the school has a large playground, amphitheatre, sensory garden, a field with games pitches, a purpose-built quiet area and a Forest School nature area with pond.

We have around 400 pupils in the school, with four classes in each year group.

At St Michael's, broadening children's horizons is very much an important part of what we do, not just in the classroom, but through a wide range of school trips and extra-curricular activities.

We have an inclusive approach to meeting each individual child's needs, whatever they may be. Each child's experiences are underpinned by exceptional care, guidance and support.

That support extends to enabling parents to help their child achieve their full potential. Our Pastoral Team has an excellent reputation in supporting families, children's emotional and behavioural development - including support groups for parents and our special Family Room, which is open to all.







## Learning for life

Our curriculum is designed to create happy, successful young people with a love of learning which will stay with them for the rest of their lives, and who will make a worthwhile and positive contribution to the community as children and as adults.

We aim to make learning compelling and exciting, as well as helping children see how it is relevant to the wider world, and to fulfilling their aspirations and potential in that world. Teaching draws on real life scenarios and problems, with subjects often linked into themes and topics – enabling children to explore a wide range of subject areas in creative and meaningful ways.

As part of the learning process, visitors are brought into school from outside the education world, and children go out on many trips, and are encouraged to be independent in their learning.

#### Behaviour

We have high expectations of our children for their behaviour, and we have received glowing comments in both our Ofsted and SIAMS inspection reports for the calm and safe atmosphere in the school. We are recognised widely for our successful use of restorative approaches, with children learning conflict resolution skills.

## Broadening horizons

At St Michaels we aim to help our children understand that there are great opportunities for them beyond the world they already know.

This broadening of their horizons is an important part of their education, helping to raise their aspirations and give them the confidence to fulfil their potential.

A central part of this is our extensive programme of extra-curricular activities, with a wide variety of clubs ranging from fencing to archery, dance to writing, cricket to rock climbing. Most children enjoy taking part in at least one of these clubs each week.

We also offer our pupils a wide choice of trips, both locally and beyond the county. Every child will have the opportunity to experience a major London theatre trip as part of this programme.

#### Breakfast and After School Clubs

With both breakfast and After School Clubs available on the school site, our extended Schools provision means that you can be confident your child is safe, happy and taking part in a wide variety of activities. We also offer holiday clubs during school holidays..
