All children across the school have access to the extra-curricular activities. 2. Good use of TAs at lunchtime to encourage children to participate in active lunchtimes. 3. Appreciating this need, we plan to introduce swimming across the whole school with a 'pop-up' swimming pool, thus meeting the requirements of the national curriculum. We will also start swimming lessons in our federated infant school in Year 2 to develop water confidence as soon as there is pool availability. |

This will be used by every child in the school and will therefore be above the national curriculum requirement to 'provide swimming instruction <i>either</i> in key stage 1 or key stage 2'. We will also invite children from our federated school, Clover Hill Infant and Nursery School, to use the pool to help develop water confidence in their Y2 children. |
